PROGRAMME



How can we deal with complicated, prolonged and debilitating forms of grief, so frequent with premature and violent deaths? This full-day workshop offers in-depth training in specific trauma-informed techniques and methods for people struggling to develop adaptive grieving. A world of meaning challenged by the traumatic loss can be re-constructed. These therapeutic techniques and methods will be illustrated making extensive use of actual clinical videos and discussed nesting them both within the therapy relationship and in the context of current theories and research that provide flexible frameworks for intervention. Through an experiential work in small groups, carried out with the cooperation of Agnieszka Konopka, Robert Neimeyer will help the participants to go more deeply into complicated grief, practicing in small group body-centered and emotion-focused methods for promoting meaning making regarding one's own experience of grief.

Beginning with a discussion of the power of presence as a fundamental dimension of the therapeutic "holding environment," we will consider how we can quickly assess our clients' needs and readiness for change. Drawing on clinical videos of clients contending with losses through cancer, sudden accident and suicide we will learn to listen between the lines of the stories clients tell themselves and others about the death to grasp more fully the unvoiced meaning of their grief, and how we can help them integrate the event story of the death into the larger narrative of their lives.

is one of the most important representative of the narrative perspective in psychotherapy and his theory of grief as a meaning making is a reference point in all the world. Professor in the Department of Psychology, University of Memphis, where he also maintains an active clinical practice. Since completing his doctoral training at the University of Nebraska in 1982, he has published 500 articles and chapters and 30 books, including *Techniques of Grief Therapy* and *Grief and the Expressive Arts: Practices for Creating Meaning* (both with Routledge), and serves as Editor of the journal *Death Studies*. Founder and Director of the Portland Institute for Loss and Transition, Neimeyer has been given Lifetime Achievement Awards by both the Association for Death Education and Counseling and the International Network on Personal Meaning.
